

Sermon Notes: "Beyond the Certificate"

Matthew 5:31-32

2.2.25

Big Idea:

Kingdom Marriage flows from heart transformation, not religious performance.

Historical Context:

- School of Shammai (Conservative View)
- School of Hillel (Liberal View)
- **POINT:** Jesus moves beyond legal <u>debate</u> to restore God's <u>original</u> intent for marriage. (*see Matthew 19:4-6*)

Understanding God's Heart in Divorce:

- Sexual <u>Unfaithfulness</u>
- Abandonment by an Unbelieving Spouse
- Abuse

Notable Takeaways:

- Sinful human beings are able to twist God's good provisions to their own sinful ends.
- Jesus radically elevated marriage from a social contract to a divine <u>covenant</u>, protecting the dignity of both husband and <u>wife</u>.

So What?

- 1. Singleness / Those Considering Marriage: Build Before You Buy
- 2. Married Couples: Tend the Garden Daily
- 3. For Those Affected by Divorce: Move from Broken to Beautiful

For Study, Reflection, Discussion:

- 1. Review the sermon notes from Sunday. Was there a particular point that stuck with you? What was it and why did it resonate with you?
- 2. The sermon's big idea states "Kingdom Marriage flows from heart transformation, not religious performance." How have you seen the difference between these two approaches to marriage?

Read Matthew 5:31-32

- 3. Jesus points back to God's original design for marriage in Genesis. How does viewing marriage as God's design rather than just a human institution change how we approach it?
- 4. The sermon discussed how people can twist God's provisions for their own ends. What are some ways you've seen this happen with marriage and divorce in our current culture?
- 5. Pastor mentioned that divorce was a "gracious gift of God to meet the pain and difficulty in our world filled with hard-heartedness." How does this perspective change your view of divorce while still maintaining the sanctity of marriage?
- 6. How can our church better support:
 - Singles preparing for marriage.
 - Couples strengthening their marriages.
 - Those healing from divorce.

Specific Action Step:

This week, evaluate your view of marriage and relationships. If you're:

- Single: Write down three ways you can prepare for a potential future marriage and/or consider three ways your calling of singleness can be a blessing to God's Kingdom (see the examples of Jesus and Paul)
- Married: Choose one small daily action to intentionally strengthen your marriage
- **Divorced:** Take one step toward healing by sharing your story with a trusted friend or counselor
- All: Commit to praying for marriages in our church family
